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¹Inspections: In addition to the fees listed in this table, the listee must pay fees for required inspections. Inspections may be performed by ICC-ES, a designated representative of ICC-ES, or a third-party inspection agency accredited by the International Accreditation Service (IAS). Inspections are divided into two types, qualifying and surveillance. Qualifying inspections are required the first time each plant is recognized in a listing. For qualifying inspections, the listee will also reimburse ICC-ES for actual expenses whenever qualifying inspections are performed by ICC-ES or its designated representative. Subsequent inspections are called surveillance inspections. Surveillance inspections are unannounced and their frequency is once a year unless the product is a plastic DWV piping material, which requires two unannounced inspections per year; or plastic pressure piping, which requires three unannounced inspections per year. For any inspections performed by a third-party inspection agency accredited by IAS, it is the responsibility of the listee to make proper agreement/arrangement directly with that agency including, but not limited to, ensuring that all discrepancies found during inspections are properly addressed and that the inspection reports are delivered to ICC-ES's headquarters in Whittier, California, within one month after each inspection is performed.

Qualifying/surveillance inspection fee within the United States: \$1,300. Qualifying/surveillance inspection fee outside the United States: \$2,500. When performed by ICC-ES or a designated representative of ICC-ES, the listee is charged an additional \$200 per hour for inspections requiring over three hours. When inspections are performed by an IAS-accredited third-party inspection agency, the listee is charged an administrative fee for ICC-ES review and approval of the inspection documents. At each annual renewal, there is a \$500 fee for review of the first inspection report, and an additional \$100 for each additional inspection report.

²Listing criteria: For products requiring listing criteria, submission of a listing criteria application plus fees (see application at www.icc-es-pmg.org/Criteria/) is required to initiate development. A listing criteria is required when one of the following situations applies:

- There is no code-referenced standard available.
- There is a nationally recognized standard for the product, but the codes do not cover permitted uses of the product in sufficient detail.

³Fees cover one category of product (covered by the same standard or listing criteria) yielding one listing. A separate application and listing is required for products that are covered by different standards or listing criteria.

⁴Fees are nonrefundable. The basic fee covers the application and one year of listing maintenance.

⁵An application, unless otherwise noted, is reviewed under the latest editions of the applicable International Codes. An application is also reviewed under the latest editions of the applicable Uniform Codes at the request of the listee.

⁶An "additional item" is determined by the processing technical staff, and may include each additional item requiring separate evaluation, such as WaterSense and MAPs rating compliance.

⁷For products requiring toxicology review, such as those falling under NSF 61 Section 9, an additional fee of \$2,700 is charged for the first three families per one toxicology review, and \$700 for each additional family thereafter. Note: A family is a product line with similar formulations, as approved by the laboratory that tested the products.

⁸A "variation" is determined by the processing technical staff, and may include for a given model a series of options such as handles or spouts.

⁹Re-examination is annual review of the listing to verify that:

- The standard or the code governing the product has not undergone revision that affects the listing.
- The listed product has not changed, from the initial submittal or since the previous inspection, as to product formulation, raw materials, suppliers of raw materials, or manufacturing method.
- There are no complaints or legal actions pending, related to code compliance, about the product(s) covered by the listing.
- The applicable ICC-ES Rules of Procedure or policies have not changed in such a way as to affect the listing.

¹⁰Fees are also applicable to existing models should the listee make technical changes to these models or should changes to the code(s) and/or listing criteria require new technical review.
